The Canton community was stunned by news of the arrest of Canton High School teacher Nicole Gordon, who was charged with tampering with evidence at a crime scene, obstructed administration of law enforcement function, possession of drug paraphernalia, and endangering the welfare of a child.

Ms. Gordon, 35, has been placed on administrative leave from her position as a reading specialist teacher at CHS.

American Legion Post 167 Morris Run

Announces Scholarship

At the regular scheduled meeting of American Legion Post 167, Morris Run, the members approved funding scholarships for the 2015-2016 school year totaling \$50,000.

Since North Penn has closed and students moved to Liberty and Mansfield Schools they will receive \$15,000 each and Canton and Troy \$10,000 each.

The money is to be divided into individual scholarships which should include both four year colleges and two year technical or trade schools.

The selection of the students is up to the individual schools. The Legion only requires that it be based on merit, need, and a display of patriotism.

They also require that they be notified as to who received the scholarships and what their future plans are.
