## Troy holds on to beat Athens for league win

ATHENS — Troy baseball got a big day out of Reed Palmer as they shut down Athens to the tune of 5-1 in NTL baseball action Tuesday.

The Trojans used a 2-run second to get out in front, with both teams scoring a run in the third. They added two more safety runs in the fifth for the 4-run win.

Palmer went 3-for-4 with two runs scored at the plate, then got the save, pitching the final 1 1/3-innings with one strikeout and one walk.

Camryn Harwick got the win, going 5 2/3-innings with nine strikeouts, three walks, three hits, and one unearned run.

Brendan Gilliland (2-for-4) scored twice while Joseph Frye (2-for-4) had a multi-hit game.

Clayton Smith (1-for-4) scored and drove in a run with Jackson Taylor (1-for-4) and Camden Allen (1-for-4) each getting an RBI. Lincoln Chimics (1-for-4) also had a hit.

In the second Palmer had a 1-out single then scored on an error off the bat of Allen.

Clayton Smith would reach on a fielder's choice, then scored two batters later on a Taylor single for the 2-0 lead.

In the third Gilliland had a 1-out hit then scored on an error in the outfield on a Chimics fly-out to make it 3-0.

Athens got the run back in the bottom half of the inning to cut the lead to 2-runs

## Canton holds on to beat CV

WESTFIELD — Once again Canton edged CV by a run, 5-4, during NTL baseball action Tuesday.

The Warriors used a 4-run third inning to go up 5-0. CV cut it to 5-2 in the bottom half of the inning, then got two more in the fifth, but couldn't quite close the gap.

The Holden Ward-Zach Colton combination proved fruitful once again for Canton. Ward went four innings - 78 pitches - with six strikeouts, four walks, and no hits, with two runs, one of which was earned.

Colton went the final three innings - 57 pitches - to strikeout four with five hits, one walk, and two earned runs.

Holden Ward (2-for-4) had a double with a run scored at the plate with Ben Fitch (1-for-3) getting a double with 2-RBI and a run scored.

Michael Beers (1-for-3) had a double with an RBI as Colton (1-for-2) drove in a run and scored himself.

Mason Harold (1-for-3) had an RBI with Bailey Gardner (1-for-4) scoring, as Hudson Ward also crossed home.

Canton got one in the top of the first as Holden Ward led off with a double. Then, with two outs, Colton brought him with a hit for the 1-0 lead.

In the third Hudson Ward had a 1-out walk, followed

## Canton's McRoberts takes three wins

CANTON — The Canton boys and girls teams both came in third against big schools, Athens and Wellsboro, during NTL tri-meet action Tuesday.

The girls scored 48 points, with Athens (86) winning, and Wellsboro (55) second, while on the boys' side the Warriors finished with 27 points, as Wellsboro (92.5) won and Athens (68.5) took second.

For the girls Alexis McRoberts (17.6) won the 100 hurdles with Daveian Crowley (13.0) taking third in the 100 dash. Crowley was also third in the 200 in 26.8.

Crowley (1:06) was second in the 400 with teammate Layla Frisbie (1:09.4) third.

McRoberts won the discus in 97-feet, 7-inches and the shot put at 31-feet, 2-inches. Stella Rockwell was second in the triple jump (29-feet, 1 1/2-inches).

Kendall Kitchen won the pole vault at 9-feet, 6-inches.

McRoberts (82-feet, 7-inches) and Natalie Kapichok (78-feet, 3-inches) went 1-2 in the javelin.

On the boys' side Thomas Guindon was third in the 110 hurdles in 19.4.

Lawrence Halbfoerster won the 1600 in 4:48 with Joshua Hess second in the 400 in 59.2. Halbfoerster also won the 800 in 2:15.2, as Brayden Vroman was third in 2:34.4.

Chase Petrowski was second in the 200 in 25.7, with Wyatt Karpinski third in the javelin at 133-feet, 7-inches.



## Troy boys earn Tri-Meet Sweep

TIOGA — The Troy boys' track and field team rolled to another tri-meet sweep against Williamson and Sayre Tuesday.

The Trojans scored 90 points with Williamson (53) second and Sayre (28) third. On the girls' side Williamson (102) won followed by Troy (70) and Sayre (8).

For the boys, Troy's 4x800 won in 10:34, while in the 110 hurdles Rylan Breidt (19.7) won as Emmitt Cole (21.9) was third.

Troy went 1-2 in the 1600 with Brody Campbell (5:19) and Hart Houseknecht (5:21). Evan Geer (58.8) was third in the 400.

Jacob Hinman (44.2) won the 300 hurdles with Breidt (54.5) third. The Trojans also went 1-2 in the 800 with Mason Wulff (2:18) and Geer (2:24.4).

Ben Warburton (23.6) won the 200 as their 4x400 relay won in 3:58.9.

Troy swept the shot put with Avery Sens (50-feet), Ty Spencer (41-feet, 10 1/4-inches), and Kael Millard (39-feet, 6-inches). Sens (107-feet, 6-inches) and Millard (104-feet, 10-inches) went 2-3 in the discus.

Colin Loveland (38-feet) and Hinman (37-feet, 9 1/2-inches) went 1-2 in the triple jump, while Warburton (20-feet, 5-inches) and Loveland (19-feet, 8-inches) went 1-2 in the long jump.

Cameron Morey won the high jump at 5-feet, 4-inches, with Houseknecht (10-feet) third in the pole vault.

On the girls' side Kylee Roy (17.6) was second in the 100 hurdles as Ellie Spalding (14.1) was second in the 100 dash.

Katie Lackey (6:04) won the 1600 with Troy's 4x100 relay winning in 56.7. Roy (52.1) and Alyssa Parks (53.4) went 1-2 in the 300 hurdles, as Lackey (2:47.3) was third in the 800.

Spalding (30.8) was second in the 200 with Troy's 4x400 winning in 4:57.9.

Madelyn Seeley (92-feet, 8-inches) won the javelin with Ella Lawton (75-feet, 10-inches) and Emma Mickley (75-feet, 9-inches) second and third in the discus.

Maddy Keeney (27-feet, 11-inches) was third in the triple jump and second in the long jump at 13-feet, 7 1/2-inches.

Troy swept the pole vault with Parks (9-feet), Katie Graham (7-feet) and Natalie Williams (7-feet). Parks (4-feet, 8-inches) and Seeley (4-feet, 6-inches) went 1-2 in the high jump.
