## Bradford Co. Dairy Promotion Scholarship

The Bradford County Dairy Promotion Board is excited to announce that it will again be offering a Scholarship and Continued Education Program. In an effort to advance and promote dairy farming in Bradford County, the Dairy Promotion Board developed this program to encourage people of all ages to pursue continued dairy education. Dairy farmers care about the health and well-being of their communities.

The program is open to any resident of Bradford County who is living and/or working on an active dairy farm. There is no age restriction on this program. The winner will be awarded \$500 toward an educational opportunity of their choosing, provided it furthers their skills in dairy farming. Higher education, college, hoof trimming school, breeding school, business management courses, Quickbook classes, and financial business training are just a few of the educational opportunities that qualify. Recipients will have one year to use the awarded funds.

Candidates must submit a written essay of 300 words or less stating "What dairy farming in Bradford County means to me". Included with the essay should be the candidate's name, address, phone number, and dairy farm on which they live or are employed by. Essays can be submitted via email to Saraj@cnbankpa.com, in person, or by mail to Citizens & Northern Bank, Attn: Trust Dept/ Bradford Co Dairy Scholarship, 428 Main Street, Towanda, PA 18848. Deadline for entries is close of business on April 19, 2018.

Preliminaries consist of a five minute interview, one or more performing arts presentations of their choice, evaluations of a shortened aerobics and fitness routine, and a presence and presentation routine. Scholarship and achievement is based upon GPA and community and school activities.

After contestants are chosen, they are invited to attend summer activities and a day long get together rehearsal to become acquainted. ## Canton Borough Hires Lifeguards

Canton Borough Council held its April meeting with President Mike Shultz, Councilors Lynnette Ambruch, David Groover, John Mosser and Ken Robertson, Mayor Rich Porter, Administrator Amy Seeley, Police Chief Doug Seeley, Officer Mike Northup, Solicitor David Brann, and an audience of seven, including Fire Chief J. Scott May.

After the Pledge of Allegiance and the Invocation, Council approved the minutes of the March meeting. The bills were accepted for payment.

There were no visitor comments.

Mr. Brann gave the Solicitor's Report and referred to Brian Krise's concerns expressed at the March meeting. PennDOT had notified Mr. Krise that it may seek to use his property along Springbrook Drive as a staging area for a future bridge project in that area, and Mr. Krise wondered if he would need permits for such activity. Mr. Brann said that because PennDOT had indicated they might make use of the lot through eminent domain, "It would not be a voluntary action [on the part of Mr. Krise], therefore PennDOT, and not the

landowner, would be responsible for permits, etc. It would be their responsibility to contact the Borough, not his," Mr. Brann said. Mrs. Seeley provided financial information for Council and also gave the Zoning report. She said she had been busy with zoning letters and permits.

Council authorized "Help Canton Borough Council Clean Up The Streets Of Canton, Your Community," on April 28 from 9 am to 12:30 pm. Gloves, vests and garbage bags have been provided by the Clean Up Pennsylvania group. Volunteers are to meet at the War Memorial Pool pavilion at 9 am.

Council approved a resolution authorizing the Innes Hose Co./Canton Fire Department to participate in the Federal Surplus Property Distribution program. As host municipality, Canton Borough's permission is required in order for the fire company to use this program.

Thank you notes or calls were received from a property owner commending the Borough's inter maintenance and from another resident thanking the Borough for facilitating the replacement of a burned-out street light.

Council declined to make a donation to the Canton Little League. After the meeting it was indicated that Council was very supportive of Little League but has concerns that making a donation could lead to requests from many other organizations.
